This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students who reach the National Minimum Standard for Reading in Year 3 from 92% to 95% and Year 5 from 89% to 92%.
- Increase the percentage of students who reach the National Minimum Standard for Numeracy in Year 3 from 94% to 96% and Year 5 from 85% to 88%.
- Diagnose learning difficulties for students.
- Provide individualised support for students who are below the National Minimum Standard.

Our strategy will be to

- Increase intervention support available to students in the early phase.
- Review student performance data regularly and implement intervention programs based on the data.
- Improve teacher capability through focused coaching and professional development to improve student performance.
- Provide extension opportunities (IMPACT program) for U2B students in Year 3 and 5.

Employing a range of professionals to work with early phase students in the area of Reading and Numeracy.	\$ 65, 000
Providing professional development to staff in order to increase knowledge of the teaching of Reading and Numeracy.	\$ 42, 970
Employ a Pedagogy Coach to work with teachers on the teaching of Literacy and Numeracy (0.5 Semester 2).	\$ 20, 000
Enrolling students in online extension projects (IMPACT).	\$ 8, 000
Purchase resources in order to implement quality Reading and Numeracy intervention programs in the early phase of learning.	\$ 20, 000
